Because these are funded by the above-mentioned sources, please do not share usernames and passwords with those who are not part of the immediate Upper Arlington School District community. To do so will jeopardize the license agreements that the school district hold with the subscription database vendors.

Click on the Databases icon in the right-hand corner. The list of databases is arranged alphabetically. Scroll down the page until you find the database or eBook you need.

**NoodleTools** is a suite of interactive tools designed to aid students and professionals with their online research. Use NoodleBib to generate, edit, and publish MLA and APA-style source lists.
